




- We are excited to welcome Mrs. Sally Latchford to our staff team from the commencement of second term.

Villa Walk for Water

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL - Sunday March 30, 2025 Fourth Sunday of Lent (Year C)

Gospel: Luke 15:1-3, 11-32 One day when many tax collectors and other outcasts came to listen to Jesus, the Pharisees and the teachers of the Law started grumbling, "This man welcomes outcasts and even eats with them!" So Jesus told them this parable:

"There was once a man who had two sons. The younger one said to him, 'Father, give me my share of the property now.' So the man divided his property between his two sons. After a few days the younger son sold his part of the property and left home with the money. He went to a country far away, where he wasted his money in reckless living. He spent everything he had. Then a severe famine spread over that country, and he was left without a thing. So he went to work for one of the citizens of that country, who sent him out to his farm to take care of the pigs. He wished he could fill himself with the bean pods the pigs ate, but no one gave him anything to eat. At last he came to his senses and said, 'All my father's hired workers have more than they can eat, and here I am about to starve! I will get up and go to my father and say, "Father, I have sinned against God and against you. I am no longer fit to be called your son; treat me as one of your hired workers."' So he got up and started back to his father.

"He was still a long way from home when his father saw him; his heart was filled with pity, and he ran, threw his arms round his son, and kissed him. 'Father,' the son said, 'I have sinned against God and against you. I am no longer fit to be called your son.' But the father called his servants. 'Hurry!' he said. 'Bring the best robe and put it on him. Put a ring on his finger and shoes on his feet. Then go and get the prize calf and kill it, and let us celebrate with a feast! For this son of mine was dead, but now he is alive; he was lost, but now he has been found.' And so the feasting began.

"In the meantime the elder son was out in the field. On his way back, when he came close to the house, he heard the music and dancing. So he called one of the servants and asked him, 'What's going on?' 'Your brother has come back home,' the servant answered, 'and your father has killed the prize calf, because he got him back safe and sound.'

The elder brother was so angry that he would not go into the house; so his father came out and begged him to come in. But he answered his father, 'Look, all these years I have worked for you like a slave, and I have never disobeyed your orders. What have you given me? Not even a goat for me to have a feast with my friends! But this son of yours wasted all your property on prostitutes, and when he comes back home, you kill the prize calf for him!' 'My son,' the father answered, 'you are always here with me, and everything I have is yours. But we had to celebrate and be happy, because your brother was dead, but now he is alive; he was lost, but now he has been found.'"

Parents can assist in this by modelling positive behaviour and coping strategies, having a growth mindset and acknowledging how their children are feeling. The connection that you have with your child is the most important support that can be given!

For any little ones (or even big ones!) struggling with separation anxiety as they get back into the routines of school, SchoolTV has a wonderful <u>link</u> to a book titled 'Helping Your Anxious Child: A Step-by-Step Guide for Parents' by Ronald Rapee PhD. The book includes the latest research and techniques for managing child anxiety. The book offers proven effective skills based in cognitive behavioural therapy to aid you in helping your child overcome intense fears and worries. You'll also find out how to relieve your child's anxious feelings while parenting with compassion.

Student - Led Conferences at SFX:

Tuesday 1st April Your child(ren) will be showcasing their schoolwork and discussing learning goals with you through Student-Led Conferences this week. During Student–Led Conferences, your child will lead the discussion with you about their school work, while teachers will help direct conversation.

Bookings are open on PAM

These meetings will last for 15 minutes, and **we encourage all families to attend.** Children must attend these sessions!

We have several goals for holding conferences using this format:

- For parents/carers we hope that you will get to see rather than simply be told about your child's progress
- For students we hope students will take more responsibility for their learning and can articulate what they can do
- For teachers we want teachers to have more meaningful and impactful conferences with you building Home / School connections
- For all we want to maximise our time together, create ways to partner with one another to support student success.

Questions to ask your child at Student - Led Conferences

Here are some starters for you to ask your child during their Student – Led Conference. These are suggestions, so please look them over and pick a few that you may like to ask!

- 1. What are you most proud of?
- 2. It makes me proud to see that
- 3. Can you tell me more about ...
- 4. I can tell that you improved in
- 5. What did you find challenging this term?
- 6. Did you reach your goals? Why/Why not?
- 7. What can we do together at home to support your learning?

We have deliberately formed them as Student – Led and not 3 – Way Conferences. Highly Effective Catholic Primary Schools promote Student Voice. Student – Led Conferences are identified as a significant way of developing Student Voice. The latest research and evidence around Assessment as Learning supports this.

If a parent/carer needs to have a conversation with the teacher not in the presence of the child in regards to other matters, this needs to take place at another time. Contact can be made with the class teacher requesting another time if needed.

Looking forward to positive Student Led Conferences which highlights and celebrates children's achievements.


Regional Swimming

CELEBRATING 125 YEARS AT ST MICHAEL'S CHURCH SPRINGBANK

This weekend the Springbank community will gather with Bishop Paul to celebrate the 125th anniversary of the laying of the foundation stone of St Michael's Church. In God's Hands, Joe Donegan's history of the Parish of Gordon, states that the first St Michael's Church in Springbank was erected in 1865 (on the eastern side of the existing church) when the district was known as Ormond and was part of the parish of Ballarat. When the parish of Gordon was created 150 years ago in 1875, Springbank became part of the parish, which was in the Archdiocese of Melbourne. On March 25th, 1900, Archbishop Thomas Carr laid the foundation stone for the existing St Michael's Church which was then blessed and opened on December 15th, 1900, by Dean Phelan of Melbourne. In 1961 further additions of a sanctuary and sacristy were completed and blessed by Bishop Arthur Fox. In 1980 the parish of Gordon with the church and Catholic school communities of Ballan, Gordon and Springbank were welcomed into the Diocese of Ballarat.

Amidst all of the anniversaries of buildings, it is the People of God, past and present, who are the Church, 'the living stones' for whom we give thanks at the anniversary celebrations this weekend.

FIRST RECONCILIATION

During the coming week, we will welcome 120 children from across our parish who will receive the sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time. These liturgies will be held Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at 6pm in our parish church. Please pray for these children and their families who will then move to preparing for Eucharist during second term.

PILGRIMAGE WITH ST PAUL -MISSIONARY OF HOPE

In this Jubilee year, dedicated to becoming Pilgrims of Hope, pilgrims are invited to experience the world of the early Christian communities. The Acts of the Apostles will come alive as we go out with St Paul and his companions to rediscover the faith and struggles of the early Christian communities. The proposed itinerary departs Melbourne on Sunday, September 21st 2025 with the pilgrims arriving in Istanbul and proceeding to Adana, Tarsus, Antioch, Ephesus, Troas, Kavala, Philippi, Thessalonica and Athens with the possibility of an extension to Rome. HOLY WEEK IN OUR MINISTRY DISTRICT

The Expansive Heart of a Compassionate Parent

Reflection on the Gospel-4th Sunday of Lent Year C (Luke 15:1-3, 11-32) Veronica M. Lawson RSM

Unfailing forgiveness and arms wide open to welcome back wayward sons and daughters is a key motif in today's gospel story. There is no room in the hearts of Jesus' critics for such forgiveness. From their perspective, law-abiding people should exclude "sinners" from their company. In a first-century Jewish context, it was easy enough to be a sinner. Whole groups of people, depending upon their occupation, fell into that category simply because they failed to observe one or more of the 618 prescriptions of the law. Jesus' response to his critics is the story of a parent whose adult children lose their way. One son finds his way back to the centre of family life and the support of the wider community while the other more law-abiding son seems to place himself outside the family circle, holding on to the resentment he feels at his sibling's return.

We need to attend to the gaps in the story: there may be daughters as well as sons in the family; there is surely another parent, a mother who shares the heartache of her husband when their younger son requests his share of the estate. To make such a request in this context is tantamount to wishing his parents dead. The older brother is in no way disadvantaged: he is assured of a two-thirds share according to the law as well as the ongoing love and support of his family, as his father makes clear. The contrast between the young man's acquisitive nature and his parents' capacity to relinguish substantial property in the interests of relationship is striking. No motive is offered for the son's readiness to break all his ties and get as far away as he can. In the distant country, he squanders both his inheritance and his identity. A "severe famine" becomes the catalyst for his change of direction. Famine in any age means devastation of the earth that can lead to displacement, to broken relationships and even to global conflicts. In turning back, the young man shows no real interest in a restored relationship with his family or ancestral lands. Rather, he devises a plan that will put food in his belly. He composes a speech about having sinned against his father and against God and about being prepared to share the status of the servants. Thanks to the expansive heart of an extraordinarily compassionate parent, he does not have to deliver the speech he has prepared. Famine becomes feast and so it is with our merciful God. We abandon, we even betray. We waste the bounty of Earth. Our motives for returning to the sources of love and community are very mixed, and yet our merciful God is ever ready, with our cooperation, to turn famine or flood into feast. For that to happen in our times, we must turn away from our acquisitive, wasteful ways and respond as one to the pain of our planetary home.
